Dear Parents and Carers

As you know, at Springfield Lakes State School we take our responsibility to maintain the safety of our students very seriously. This responsibility includes student cyber safety while at school as well as our students, teachers and the school's online reputation.

As you may be aware, comments posted online about a student or a teacher permanently forms part of their digital reputation. This can have an ongoing effect on the student, teacher and school's offline reputation and can also have an impact on their safety both on and offline.

Recently, a number of concerns have been raised by students, staff and parents regarding posts on Facebook negatively referencing individual students, teachers and the school.

Facebook is not a private community! Depending on individuals' security settings, the comments you make on Facebook can remain online indefinitely, be read by millions of people and have long-term effects.

If you are posting information online please be polite and respectful, ask yourself – would you make those comments to someone's face? Also, please be respectful of other people's wishes regarding their privacy, as some parents may not want information, including photos and comments regarding their children, posted on Facebook or on other sites.

When the school posts information online, whether on the school website or on a social media page, we must comply with departmental policy. We do this to maintain the safety of our students and the respect of our community. We ask parents' and carers' permission before we publish photos and we never identify students online using their full name.

I am sure every parent and carer will agree that as a school community we need to lead by example with cyber etiquette by always being polite and respectful when online. If you have any concerns or questions I encourage you to make a time to come and see me to discuss the matter.

NAPLAN testing time again

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will participate in the annual National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) testing next month, to assess their skills and understanding in the areas of reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The tests will be conducted in all state and non-state schools across the country from 15–17 May 2012. NAPLAN assesses the skills that students develop over time through the school curriculum, and provides additional feedback for parents, carers and teachers on how students are progressing in the key curriculum areas. Why make a Voluntary Contribution when education is free?

The definition of free education is the provision of **Instruction** and **facilities** for educational purposes.
